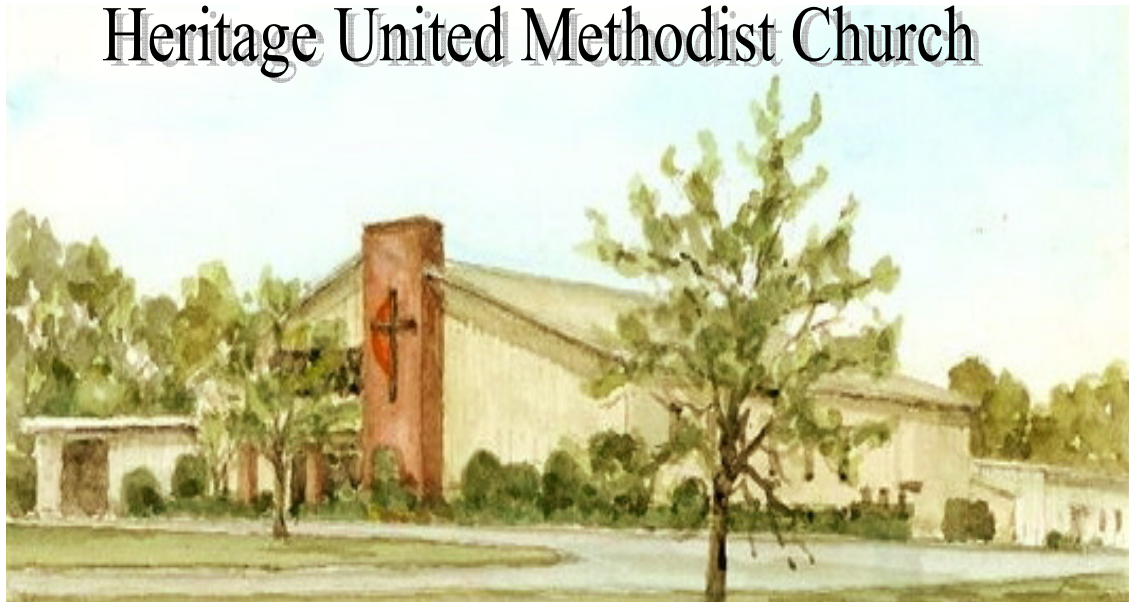

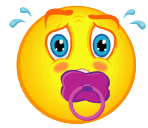
ATTENTION ALL: Please join us for 11 a.m. worship on July 12 when Andy Lemmon, Summer Intern, will make a Summer Mission presentation.
